They also learn to use a variety of technological strategies, including Smart boards, Power Point presentations, YouTube videos, Zoom, Blackboard Collaborate, Loom, Microsoft Teams, and Social Media in instruction. In the capstone clinical experiences, we verify that candidates gain real-world practice in utilizing technology via a performance assessment, verified by a product: the Instructional Assessment. This hallmark assessment requires clinical candidates to assess the learning of their students and to analyze it deeply to inform instruction. They create blueprints for assessment and their own assessment measures based on performance results. Through this assignment and in weekly seminars, the candidates verify that they instruct their P-12 students in the use of Google docs, YouTube videos, and Power Point presentations.
