1	40.1	Our reading of the proposal is that this is a one-time project which resulted from the Negotiated Resolution as defined in the RFP. This section says the contract shall include up to two one year renewal options. Do you anticipate this to potentially be a recurring project?
		The Negotiated Resolution requires only a single compliance audit. However, the University may wish to have subsequent audits conducted to prevent recurring compliance issues.

		The cost proposal is to be a single paper copy submitted under separate cover as directed in Section 50.3.
