## **REGULATION STATEMENT:**

This regulation governs the acceptance and application of academic credit earned at other accredited institutions. It is designed to ensure a seamless and equitable transfer process for students, in accordance with the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education (CPE) General Education Transfer Policy.

#### **DEFINITIONS:**

## **Fully Accredited Institution**

An institution that is a member in good standing of one of the six regional academic accrediting associations.

#### **General Education Certified**

A designation from another Kentucky public institution indicating a student has completed all general education

requirements. KSU will honor this designation.

## **Core Certified**

A designation from another Kentucky public institution indicating a student has completed the core block of general education requirements. KSU will honor this designation.

# **Category Certified**

A designation from another Kentucky public institution indicating a student has completed a specific category of general education requirements. KSU will honor this designation.

#### **PROCESS:**

## **General Requirements**

Students transferring to KSU must submit official transcripts from all previously attended institutions as part of the admissions process.

KSU accepts transfer credits earned at fully accredited institutions.

# **Grade and Credit Acceptance**

KSU accepts transfer credits for courses in which a student earned a grade of "D" or better.

**Exception:** Transfer equivalents for ENG 101 and ENG 102 require a grade of "C" or better.

If a course is transferred with a "D" grade and that course is required for the student's major, minor, or area of specialization, the student must retake the course at KSU and earn a grade of "C" or better.

Credits that do not fulfill specific requirements but were earned with a "D" or better will be accepted as free electives.

#### Limitations

KSU will not grant upper-level credit for courses completed at a two-year junior or community college without validation from the respective academic department that the course is equivalent to an upper-level KSU course.

**Residency Requirement:** Regardless of the number of hours accepted for transfer, all candidates for a KSU undergraduate degree must complete 30 of their last 36 credit hours at Kentucky State University.
